Tutors United deliver confidence-boosting, attainment-raising tutorials to some of Planet Earth's coolest primary school pupils to bring the benefits of tutoring to every child, ensuring their socio-economic background doesn't hinder how much they can achieve in life.

We do this by employing and training inspiring university students to deliver after school small group tuition in core subjects with a specially devised curriculum, designed by expert teachers. We are the affordable option for parents and Housing Associations who want to see fantastic results for primary school children from less privileged backgrounds.

Since the organisation was established in 2013, we have hired and trained over 250 university students and tutored over 1,200 low-income primary school pupils across 18 London Boroughs and three UK cities with consistent results for academic progress.

We are at an exciting point in the organisation's development with plans for expansion and launching new services. Therefore we are looking for additional trustees to bring additional skills and expertise to the organisation!

The role

We are also eager to hear from individuals with lived experience of educational inequality who may have valuable insights or skills to contribute to our mission, be it as a parent, guardian, or otherwise. Representation and diverse opinions matter at Tutors United. Therefore, we are strongly encouraging applications from groups that are underrepresented on boards, including women, Black and Asian people.



We are a driven organisation with ambitious plans for growth. The board will help with setting the strategic direction to reflect our ambitious goals and position Tutors United within the right networks to support more families. In addition to ensuring good governance, as a trustee, you will have the opportunity to influence our delivery, operations, strategy and business decisions to help the organisation address challenges and maximise opportunities so we can continue to excel and create more opportunities for young people to succeed in education and employment!

Individual appointments will be for a three-year term in the first instance. The board meets quarterly, with days and timings agreed in advance. Additional communication or ad hoc meetings may be required between board meetings. The position is voluntary and not remunerated, although reasonable travel expenses may be claimed.
